About 'Urgent Flood Relief Drive'

Introduction

The Urgent Flood Relief Drive was conducted to provide immediate relief to the victims of the recent floods affecting the districts of Rasuwa, Nuwakot, Dhading, Gorkha, and Chitwan, with the disaster initially beginning near the Nepal–Tibet border at Gyirong Port. The seven day event was carried out in different phases, focusing on collecting donations, raising funds, providing daily essentials, hygiene products and arranging urgent medical items for those affected by the flood.

Summary

In the first phase, the Rotary Club of Kathmandu, Rotaract Club of Kathmandu and Interact Club of Kathmandu came together to collect warm clothes for the flood victims. With many families having lost their homes and belongings in the floods, they were left without basic necessities, including clothing. As the affected areas continued to experience rain and cold weather, warm clothes were considered one of the most immediate needs.

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Therefore, the first phase focused on collecting and providing clothing to help those affected stay warm and protected during the difficult days following the disaster.





In the second phase, the clubs received a list of urgently needed supplies from the affected communities, including sanitary pads, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, other hygiene products, food, medicines, and ORS. Based on these requirements, members came together to collect and arrange the necessary supplies, which were then provided to the flood-affected families. This phase focused on addressing their immediate health, hygiene, food, and basic needs during the difficult situation.

In the third and final phase, the relief drive was continued through Gai Jatra, with donations being collected as part of the festival. Members collected rice and other food supplies, which were contributed to the ongoing flood relief efforts. The monetary donations collected during the jatra were directed to the PMO Disaster Fund to support further relief and recovery efforts. The collection and distribution efforts were carried out in coordination with the CDO and APF, ensuring that the support reached those affected by the disaster.

The collected clothes, food, medicines, ORS, sanitary pads, and hygiene products from all three phases were distributed among the flood-affected families according to their needs. The donations provided immediate relief to those who had lost their homes and belongings, helping them manage the difficult aftermath of the floods.

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
